Privacy policy

Our mission is to show young people a different view of the world by strengthening and developing their potential, helping them choose career paths and supporting them in the development of passions and ideas. We do this by promoting access to high-quality education, reaching engaged young students and connecting them with the best higher education institutions, mentors and the labour market. Our goal is to build a growing global community of young leaders by proactively engaging our students to create a cycle of support for future generations.

To achieve its statutory objectives, the Another Perspective Foundation, both through the website <https://www.a-perspective.com> and directly, collects personal data that users consciously provide to us. We only collect the data we need to conduct our statutory activities. This Policy describes the rules for the collection and use of website users' data, which is collected directly from them or via cookies and similar technologies.

This privacy policy ("Policy") describes ANOTHER PERSPECTIVE FOUNDATION ul. JEMIOŁOWA, nr 44, WIERZCHOWISKO, kod 42-233, mail MYKANÓW, registered in the national court register under no KRS: 0000996535, "we", "us" or "our") collects, protects and uses the personally identifiable information ("Personal Information") you ("User", "you" or "your") may provide on the <https://www.a-perspective.com> website and any of its products (collectively, "Website").

It also describes the choices available to you regarding our use of your Personal Information and how you can access and update this information. This Policy does not apply to the practices of companies that we do not own or control, or to individuals that we do not employ or manage.

Automatic collection of information

Our top priority is customer data security and, as such, we exercise the no logs policy. We process only minimal user data, only as much as it is essential to maintain the Website. Information collected automatically is used only to identify potential cases of abuse and establish statistical information regarding Website usage. This statistical information is not otherwise aggregated in such a way that would identify any particular user of the system.



Collection of personal information

You can visit the Website without telling us who you are or revealing any information by which someone could identify you as a specific, identifiable individual. If, however, you wish to use some of the Website's features, you will be asked to provide certain Personal Information (for example, your name and e-mail address). We receive and store any information you fill any online forms on the Website. When required, this information may include the following:

- Your IP address.
- Your contact information and email address.
- Other information such as interests and preferences.
- Data profile regarding your online behaviour on our website.

You can choose not to provide us with your Personal Information, but then you may not be able to take advantage of some of the Website's features. Users who are uncertain about what information is mandatory are welcome to contact us.

Managing personal information

You can delete certain Personal Information we have about you. When you delete Personal Information, however, we may maintain a copy of the unrevised Personal Information in our records for the duration necessary to comply with our obligations to our affiliates and partners, and for the purposes described below. If you would like to delete your Personal Information or permanently delete your account, you can do so by contacting us.

Storing personal information

We will retain and use your Personal Information for the period necessary to comply with our legal obligations, resolve disputes, and enforce our agreements unless a longer retention period is required or permitted by law. We may use any aggregated data derived from or incorporating your Personal Information after you update or delete it, but not in a manner that would identify you personally. Once the retention period expires, Personal Information shall be deleted. Therefore, the right to access, the right to erasure, the right to rectification and the right to data portability cannot be enforced after the expiration of the retention period.

Use and processing of collected information

To make our Website available to you, or to meet a legal obligation, we need to collect and use certain Personal Information. If you do not provide the information that we request, we may not be able to provide you with the requested products or services. Some of the information we collect is directly from you via our Website. However, we may also collect Personal Information about you from other sources. Any of the information we collect from you may be used for the following purposes:



1. Send administrative information
2. Send marketing and promotional communications
3. Respond to inquiries and offer support
4. Request user feedback
5. Improve user experience
6. Enforce terms and conditions and policies
7. Protect from abuse and malicious users
8. Respond to legal requests and prevent harm
9. Run and operate our Website
10. Fill out the form to apply for our Ambassador Programme

Processing your Personal Information depends on how you interact with our Website, where you are located in the world and if one of the following applies:

1. You have given your consent for one or more specific purposes. This, however, does not apply, whenever the processing of Personal Information is subject to the California Consumer Privacy Act or European data protection law - Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of individuals about the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Directive 95/46 / EC;
2. Provision of information is necessary for the performance of an agreement with you and/or for any pre-contractual obligations thereof;
3. Processing is necessary for compliance with a legal obligation to which you are subject;
4. Processing is related to a task that is carried out in the public interest or the exercise of official authority vested in us;
5. Processing is necessary for the legitimate interests pursued by us or by a third party.

Note that under some legislations we may be allowed to process information until you object to such processing (by opting out), without having to rely on consent or any other of the following legal bases below. In any case, we will be happy to clarify the specific legal basis that applies to the processing, and in particular, whether the provision of Personal Information is a statutory or contractual requirement, or a requirement necessary to enter into a contract.



Information transfer and storage

We may transfer personal data to third countries, i.e. countries outside the European Economic Area. Your data may only be transferred to third countries or entities for which an adequate level of data protection has been determined by the European Commission. In the absence of a decision of the European Commission confirming the appropriate level of protection specified in Art. 45 section 3 GDPR Your personal data may be transferred to a third country only based on binding corporate rules, standard data protection clauses adopted by the European Commission, standard data protection clauses adopted by the Polish supervisory authority and approved by the Commission, an approved code of conduct or an approved certification mechanism (Article 46 of the GDPR). In the absence of a decision from the European Commission confirming the adequate level of personal data protection under the legislation of a third country or in the absence of appropriate legal safeguards, your personal data may be transferred to a third country based on one of the grounds listed in Art. 49 section 1 GDPR, in particular, based on explicit consent. You have the right to obtain a copy of your personal data transferred to a third country.

The rights of users

You may exercise certain rights regarding your information processed by us. In particular, you have the right to do the following:

1. you have the right to withdraw consent where you have previously given your consent to the processing of your information;
2. you have the right to object to the processing of your information if the processing is carried out on a legal basis other than consent;
3. you have the right to learn if information is being processed by us, obtain disclosure regarding certain aspects of the processing and obtain a copy of the information undergoing processing;
4. you have the right to verify the accuracy of your information and ask for it to be updated or corrected;
5. you have the right, under certain circumstances, to restrict the processing of your information, in which case, we will not process your information for any purpose other than storing it;
6. you have the right, under certain circumstances, to obtain the erasure of your Personal Information from us;
7. you have the right to receive your information in a structured, commonly used and machine-readable format and, if technically feasible, to have it transmitted to another controller without any hindrance. This provision is applicable provided that your information is processed by automated means and that the processing is based on your consent, on a contract which you are part of or on pre-contractual obligations thereof.



The right to object to processing

Where Personal Information is processed for the public interest, in the exercise of an official authority vested in us or for the purposes of the legitimate interests pursued by us, you may object to such processing by providing a ground related to your particular situation to justify the objection. You must know that, however, should your Personal Information be processed for direct marketing purposes, you can object to that processing at any time without providing any justification. To learn, whether we are processing Personal Information for direct marketing purposes, you may refer to the relevant sections of this document.

How to exercise these rights

Any requests to exercise User rights can be directed to the Owner through the contact details provided in this document. These requests can be exercised free of charge and will be addressed by the Owner as early as possible.

Billing and payments

We use third-party payment processors to assist us in processing your payment information securely. Such third-party processors' use of your Personal Information is governed by their respective privacy policies which may or may not contain privacy protections as protective as this Privacy Policy. We suggest that you review their respective privacy policies.

Privacy of children

We do not knowingly collect any Personal Information from children under the age of 16. If you are under the age of 16, please do not submit any Personal Information through our Website. We encourage parents and legal guardians to monitor their children's Internet usage and to help enforce this Policy by instructing their children never to provide Personal Information through our Website without their permission.

If you have reason to believe that a child under the age of 16 has provided Personal Information to us through our Website, please contact us. You must also be at least 16 years of age to consent to the processing of your Personal Information in your country (in some countries we may allow your parent or guardian to do so on your behalf).



Newsletters

We offer electronic newsletters to which you may voluntarily subscribe at any time. We are committed to keeping your email address confidential and will not disclose your email address to any third parties except as allowed in the information use and processing section or to utilize a third-party provider to send such emails. We will maintain the information sent via e-mail by applicable laws and regulations.

In compliance with the CAN-SPAM Act, all e-mails sent from us will clearly state who the e-mail is from and provide clear information on how to contact the sender. You may choose to stop receiving our newsletter or marketing emails by following the unsubscribe instructions included in these emails or by contacting us. However, you will continue to receive essential transactional emails.

Cookies

The Website uses "cookies" to help personalize your online experience. A cookie is a text file that is placed on your hard disk by a web page server. Cookies cannot be used to run programs or deliver viruses to your computer. Cookies are uniquely assigned to you, and can only be read by a web server in the domain that issued the cookie to you.

We may use cookies to collect, store, and track information for statistical purposes to operate our Website. You can accept or decline cookies. Most web browsers automatically accept cookies, but you can usually modify your browser settings to decline cookies if you prefer. If you choose to decline cookies, you may not be able to fully experience the features of the Website. To learn more about cookies and how to manage them, visit internetcookies.org

Do Not Track signals

Some browsers incorporate a Do Not Track feature that signals to websites you visit that you do not want to have your online activity tracked. Tracking is not the same as using or collecting information in connection with a website. For these purposes, tracking refers to collecting personally identifiable information from consumers who use or visit a website or online service as they move across different websites over time. How browsers communicate the Do Not Track signal is not yet uniform. As a result, this Website is not yet set up to interpret or respond to Do Not Track signals communicated by your browser. Information security

We secure the information you provide on computer servers in a controlled, secure environment, protected from unauthorized access, use, or disclosure. We maintain reasonable administrative, technical, and physical safeguards to protect against unauthorized access, use, modification, and disclosure of Personal Information in its control and custody. However, no data transmission over the Internet or wireless network can be guaranteed. Therefore, while we strive to protect your Personal Information, you acknowledge that

1. there are security and privacy limitations of the Internet which are beyond our control;
2. the security, integrity, and privacy of any and all information and data exchanged between you and our Website cannot be guaranteed; and
3. any such information and data may be viewed or tampered with in transit by a third party, despite best efforts.

Data breach

In the event, that we become aware that the security of the Website has been compromised or user Personal Information has been disclosed to unrelated third parties as a result of external activity, including, but not limited to, security attacks or fraud, we reserve the right to take reasonably appropriate measures, including, but not limited to, investigation and reporting, as well as notification to and cooperation with law enforcement authorities. In the event of a data breach, we will make reasonable efforts to notify affected individuals if we believe that there is a reasonable risk of harm to the user as a result of the breach or if notice is otherwise required by law. When we do, we will post a notice on the Website, and send you an email.

Legal Disclosure

We will disclose any information we collect, use or receive if required or permitted by law, such as to comply with a subpoena or similar legal process, and when we believe in good faith that disclosure is necessary to protect our rights, protect your safety or the safety of others, investigate fraud, or respond to a government request.



Changes and amendments

We may update this Privacy Policy from time to time at our discretion and will notify you of any material changes to how we treat Personal Information. When changes are made, we will post a notification on the main page of our Website. We may also provide notice to you in other ways at our discretion, such as through the contact information you have provided. Any updated version of this Privacy Policy will be effective immediately upon the posting of the revised Privacy Policy unless otherwise specified. Your continued use of the Website after the effective date of the revised Privacy Policy (or such other act specified at that time) will constitute your consent to those changes. However, we will not, without your consent, use your Personal Data in a manner materially different than what was stated at the time your Personal Data was collected.

Acceptance of this policy

You acknowledge that you have read this Policy and agree to all its terms and conditions. By using the Website or its Services you agree to be bound by this Policy. If you do not agree to abide by the terms of this Policy, you are not authorized to use or access the Website and its Services.
